WHY IS SCRIPTURE MEMORY ESSENTIAL?

• The THEOLOGICAL Why: When facing temptation, Jesus depended upon memorized Scripture (Mt. 4:1-11).

 The PRACTICAL Why: When facing temptation, we cannot retrieve what we have not memorized (Psa. 119:10-11).

• The SPIRITUAL Why: When facing temptation, we <u>prepare</u> for the enemy's deception by <u>wielding</u> the Word of Truth well (Eph. 6:17).



EPHESIANS 6:17

¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth,...¹⁷ and take...the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

How do you Memorize Scripture?

- Be CONSISTENT—find a pattern that works for you and practice it.
- Be PATIENT—forgetting and relearning is an essential part of the memorization process.
- Be INQUISITIVE—the meaning of the text matters for proper retrieval (Mt. 4:4 & Dt. 8:3).



PRACTICE A PATTERN

REPEAT TO REMEMBER

- Day 1 25 times
- Day 2 20 times
- Day 3 15 times
- Day 4 10 times
- Day 5 5 times

One week total: 75 times

REVIEW TO RETAIN

- Daily for 1 month
- Weekly for 1 year
- Monthly for 2nd year

Two-year total: 95 times

MASTER THRU MINISTRY



WHAT PASSAGES SHOULD YOU MEMORIZE?

- The Lie/Truth Formula: we memorize passages that answer the deceptive nature of temptation. This is how we learn to say "no" to the temptation.
- The Promise/Passage Formula: we memorize passages about the character of God and the nature of the Gospel. As we love God more, we will love sin less. This is how we weaken the appeal of the temptation over time.



When & Where should you Memorize Scripture?

Anytime and anywhere



 FOR THOSE STRUGGLING WITH DESTRUCTIVE BEHAVIORS
 The WORD of God is your weapon The memorized Word prepares your mind for spiritual battle (2 Cor. 10:5).

• The WILL of God is your purpose *The memorized Word strengthens your desire to surrender* (Ps. 40:8).

- The LOVE of God is your comfort The memorized Word affirms God's love of you (Zeph. 3:17).
- The GLORY of God is your intention



The memorized word directs your focus to the glory of God (1 Cor. 6:19-20)
